



### Egypt's Participation in Monitoring Rounds


- Since 2011, Egypt partook in all 3 monitoring rounds (2014, 2016 & 2018).
- In the 2018 Monitoring Round, Egypt's performance has been visibly recognized to reflect positive progress compared to the 2016 Monitoring Round results, in terms of country ownership, national planning, predictability, public financial management systems and tracking systems.

## **GPEDC 2018 Monitoring Round: Egypt - Key Findings**



2018







- The principles were informed by the results of the case studies of 4 countries, including Egypt, on Private Sector Engagement in development.
- Egypt's case study presented policy suggestions
   and action areas where development cooperation can prompt effective private sector engagement.
- It included a mapping of 277 PSE projects and partnerships that were mobilized through development cooperation and interviews with local stakeholders.



#### Private Sector Engagement Through Development Co-operation in Egypt

#### Case study

This case study was prepared by Shannon Kindornay and Zeki Kocaata with Thomas Boehler and Rafael Duque Figueira from the OECD-UNDP Joint Support Team of the Global Partnership. It informed a technical note and inclusive policy dialogue to formulate key issue areas for principles and guide-lines for effective private sector engagement supported by development co-operation, a key output of the Global Partnership under its current 2017-2018 Work Programme. The study was updated based on consultations and interviews at country level. It also serves as basis for inclusive dialogue at country level to improve the effectiveness of private sector engagement supported by development co-operation in Egypt.


## Egypt's Contribution to the New Monitoring Framework

- Egypt has been an active participant in the multilateral dialogues that took place over the last 3 years and aimed to increase the efficiency of the monitoring exercise.
- As an important milestone in the reform of the Global Partnership monitoring, the Ministry of International Cooperation took part in a multi-stakeholder workshop, in Cotonou, Benin, which aimed at shaping the evidence to be collected and the process to engage stakeholders in the global tracking of effective development co-operation principles.
- Consultations in the workshop informed the proposal of the Steering Committee for the new monitoring exercise which the Committee endorsed at its meeting in July 2022.




