2. WORKING ARRANGEMENTS TO REFINE THE GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP MONITORING FRAMEWORK

In order to deliver on the multiple and sequenced activities described above, the OECD-UNDP Joint Support Team will rely on close collaboration with expert groups, regional and global thematic networks, participating countries and their development partners, and policy communities within the OECD and the UN system.

For each of the three tracks of work, the following working arrangements will apply:

Track 1: Strengthening current Global Partnership indicators

Building on the work already carried out by the Monitoring Advisory Group, and the stock-take carried out after the 2016 Monitoring Round, six reference groups comprising relevant development experts and practitioners have been established to help refine the existing indicators. With joint technical direction from OECD and UNDP, each reference group focuses on indicators related to specific effectiveness areas, such as public financial management systems or civil society engagement.

The table below provides an overview of the thematic groups, clustered by areas of expertise related to each indicator:

The revision work is being carried out with iterative technical work and consultation to all relevant stakeholders. Country piloting will take place in early 2018. Preliminary proposals coming out from the refinement exercise will be subjected to broad consultations by March 2018.

Track 2: Adapting the scope of monitoring

Developing agreed approaches to monitor rigorously effectiveness beyond ODA and for emerging development issues requires a longer haul perspective and sequencing. In terms of process, the work will start in Q3 2017 and continue thru 2018. The work will build on the shared expertise and technical networks from OECD and UNDP. New areas will be addressed in sequence, maximising synergies with ongoing work carried out by these organisations and expert communities — thus benefiting from their expertise and joint reach. New areas or monitoring approaches ready by April 2018 will be piloted or integrated in the upcoming monitoring round, while work will continue for other areas requiring a greater degree of maturity and consensus around the proposed monitoring approaches.

Track 3: Strengthening country-level monitoring and follow-up

REFINING THE GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP MONITORING FRAMEWORK

During 2015-2016, the Monitoring Advisory Group provided elements for a theory of change on how to strengthen the Global Partnership monitoring, proposing technical and practical recommendations to create stronger country-led arrangements that could generate useful evidence and subsequent collective action.

A follow-up survey to participants in the 2016 Monitoring round, complemented with targeted qualitative in-depth interviews with key stakeholders, also provide the foundation for work in refining the monitoring process.

Thru March 2018, the UNDP-OECD Joint Support Team will continue consulting and working with countries, development partners and non-state actors to refine the monitoring approach —and, where relevant, align it with national SDG follow-up and review processes— ahead of the 2018 monitoring round. In addition to gathering further feedback and reflect the changes in the guidance, training and support offered to participants by the UNDP-OECD Joint Support Team, three country piloting exercises will take place in early 2018 to ensure that the approach accommodates the needs of countries and stakeholders with different needs and institutional settings.
